SUBJECT: Authorization for acceptance and appropriation of FY 2010 Washington Area Vehicle Enforcement (WAVE) Emergency Overtime Reimbursement.

C. M. RECOMMENDATION:

1. Authorize the County Manager to accept \$2,000 in grant funds for overtime reimbursement related to WAVE Task Force participation.
2. Appropriate \$2,000 in FY 2010 from the Washington Area Vehicle Enforcement Emergency Overtime Reimbursement (101.364900) to the Police Department (101.31202) for overtime costs associated with the WAVE Task Force.

ISSUES: These grant funds reimburse the Police Department for overtime paid to personnel assisting the WAVE Task Force. No issues have been identified.

SUMMARY: The Police Department received a grant for \$2,000 to be used for overtime related to WAVE Task Force investigations.

BACKGROUND: The Prince George's County Police Department applied for and received \$15,000 in grant funding from the Maryland Vehicle Theft Prevention Council in support of auto theft prevention efforts. Of the available funds, \$2,000 has been set aside for reimbursement to the Arlington County Police Department for WAVE related emergency overtime.

DISCUSSION: The definition of emergency overtime is overtime that requires an employee to work beyond their scheduled tour of duty, due to an arrest or investigation, while assigned to the WAVE. This overtime funding cannot be used to support any overtime from other programs or to enhance staffing levels. The WAVE Commander must approve all overtime expenditures prior to any reimbursement.

FISCAL IMPACT: Under this award, the Prince George's County Police Department will serve as the fiscal agent and provide the Arlington County Police Department up to \$2,000 in grant funding for reimbursement of overtime activities related to the WAVE Task Force. There is no local match required to accept this grant.
